

Game Setup

Each player takes one puzzle sheet and one pen.

Starting the Game

The player whose birthday is closest goes first. Play proceeds clockwise, and steps 1.~5. are performed in order.

1. Choose a Piece

Select one piece from the piece area **A** at the bottom of the puzzle sheet. The pieces are divided into frames numbered ①~④.

Announce the piece you selected to the other players (e.g., ③ - **A**). All players mark a diagonal line through the selected piece in their sheet's corresponding frame. **1** Pieces marked with a diagonal line cannot be selected again. When playing with four or more players, pieces in frames ③④ can be selected twice. For the second selection, cross the diagonal line to form an X. **2**

2. Place the Selected Piece

The player on their turn shades the cells on their board **B** corresponding to the shape of the selected piece. The shape of the piece cannot be rotated or flipped. Pieces cannot be placed overlapping already shaded cells. **3**

3. Add Bonus Points

Frames ①~④ indicate the bonus points awarded when a piece is successfully placed. Mark the corresponding bonus points in order (1, 2, 3, etc.) in the bonus area **C**. **4**

4. Place Bonus Pieces

When a player reaches 5, 10, or 15 points, they can place the bonus piece indicated in the corresponding bonus piece area **D** onto their board. Placement rules are the same as in step 2. **5**

5. End of Turn

After completing steps 1 ~ 4, the next player takes their turn. If steps 2 or 4 cannot be completed, proceed to the **Game end**.

Game End

After step 5, each player calculates their score **E** in one final round, starting with the current player. Identify the largest complete rectangle on the board. Calculate the score as follows:

Number of vertical cells X Number of horizontal cells X Bonus points 5

The player with the highest score wins. In the event of a tie, the player with the fewest unshaded cells wins.



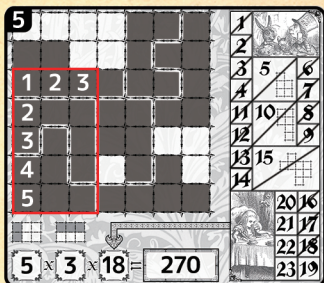
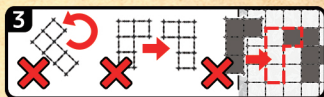
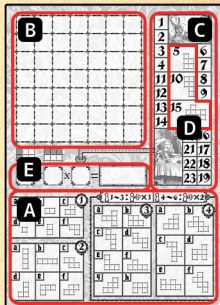

Solo Play Additional Rules

Take one puzzle sheet and one pen. You may change colors during the game if you wish. Choose your preferred board from the right-hand side and check the positions of the filled-in squares (free color). Fill in the matching squares on your puzzle sheet, then proceed to repeat steps 1 through 4 of the standard rules. If you manage to fill the entire board, you've cleared the game! It can also be enjoyed as a pixel art activity. You can freely adjust the number and positions of the filled-in squares to customize your play experience.

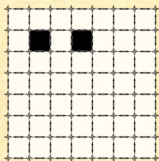
General Game Q&A

Q1. Do I use a colored pencil as my own personal color?

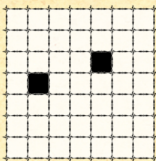
A1. You may use it as your own, or take turns sharing them with others.

Q2. There are two types of puzzle sheets—can I use them separately?

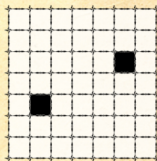
A2. You can play with them separately, but using them together allows you to better anticipate your opponent's moves and adds strategic depth.



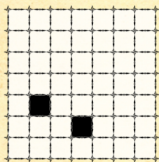

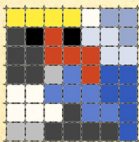
